PASTOR'S DESK by Father Hovnan Demerjian



Discover the Cross—Learn to Fly

Fall is the season of the cross in the Armenian Church, in which we have 5 holidays dedicated to finding the cross in one form or another. Why five times? Why every year? Isn't once enough? If the cross were just a thing—yes. This month's feast of the discovery of the cross (Oct. 27th) originated with Constantine's mother Helena tearing up all of Jerusalem to look for Christ's cross. Her discovery of the cross which Christ was crucified on reminds us that Jesus was a real man from a specific time, who said radical things and was crucified for them.

The life of Jesus and his words are historical facts, but they aren't just that. Whether or not Helena found a piece of the actual cross used to crucify Jesus, we would still need to celebrate the discovery of the cross....because the cross is not just a thing, but a way of life. The discovery of the cross is a personal and always present choice for every Christian based on our Lord's words "If any will

come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me." Luke 9:23

Discovering the cross is necessary 5 times a year every year, because the cross is a way of life which has God as its first priority. And we humans are so tragically prone to forgetting to put first things first.

Victor Borge told a story about a couple going on vacation, standing in line waiting to check their bags at the airline counter. The husband said to the wife, "I wish we had brought the piano." The wife said, "Why? We've got sixteen bags already!" The husband said, "Yes, I know-- but the tickets are on the piano!"

It is truly amazing what we will remember to drag with us through the journey of our lives, weighing ourselves down with 16 suitcases full of unnecessary stuff. We remember all the "stuff" which is supposedly ours, but forget where we came from and where we're going. We have it precisely backwards. We must forget (deny) ourselves and all we believe is ours, our Lord says, in order to remember where we are going.

Forget all your stuff, you can't take it with you. As our chairman often says, "I don't know about you, but I have never seen a hearse with a luggage rack!" Forget the gossip that you hear before you can repeat it. Forget each critical comment, each jealous sneer, whenever you may meet it. Even forget each praise you've won, each kindness you've done as soon as you have done it. As our Lord advises when doing good deeds, "do not even let your left hand know what your right hand is doing." (Mat. 6:13) Forget it- you were only doing your duty.

Forget all of these things, they seem important in the moment, but are only so much baggage that will drag us down. Remember the one thing necessary—rediscover the cross—the tickets to fly, the daily acts of humility, goodness and sacrifice which result from following Our Lord.

Let us remember to take up our cross daily, to bear the burden of following Him, which in the end will be no burden at all. For as Samuel Rutherford famously said, "Christ's cross is such a burden as sails are to a ship or wings to a bird," so let's take up our cross today, our tickets to fly and live a life that, through age and youth, will be found blessed, now and always and unto the ages of ages amen.


CHURCH HALL BUILDING REPORT by Chuck Sarkisian

With Faith We Shall Build | Հաւատքով Պիտի Կառուցենք

The Church Hall fund raising got reenergized after the hot summer months with our mailing campaign to our parishioners. Every St. Hagop Armenian Church household should have received a mailing with a letter and an insert explaining our effort along with a donation pledge card. A complete copy of the mailing is shown on the following pages.

Where are we today?

At the time of our mailing campaign we were stuck at a total combined amount of \$577,000 in pledges and funds raised from various activities. I am delighted to report that within the first two weeks of our campaign, the total amount increased to over \$636,000 due to pledges of 14 new donors. In addition, the total amount deposited in the Church Hall Building Fund restricted account is slightly over \$240,000 as payments against the pledges are received.



How can you help?

Our goal is to reach our \$1million through participation of all of our parishioners and to break ground on Armenian Christmas Day, January 6, 2015. We are at 64% of our goal but need your help to close the remaining gap of \$364,000. Here is how you can help:

- 1. If you have not done so, please return your pledge card. Every donation, regardless of the amount, brings us closer together financially and spiritually
- Established Goal Total Pledges Made Amount Paid-to-Date 2. Be engaged, get informed, learn about matching contributions and encourage others to participate. You can do so by volunteering to make follow-up calls to our mailing campaign. Please contact me if you are interested in volunteering.
- 3. Give thanks to God for the blessings of our generous donors to date and continue your prayers for the success of our mission

Next Steps

Our next step is to follow-up on our mailing campaign by contacting households who have not returned their pledge cards to encourage them to do so and answer any questions they may have. Our stated goal is to expand our current 65 donors to 100% participation. With God's help all things are possible.

Dear Parishioner,

I am pleased to announce that the Parish Council of St. Hagop Armenian Church has kicked-off the church hall building fund campaign in February and, as of today, we have raised 58% of our targeted \$1 million goal! Faith inspired 51 donors/families (only 9% of our parishioner base) to pledge \$537,000 with an additional \$40,000 raised from various activities. Now we are reaching out to *you* to help us close the gap and reach our goal. With Faith We Shall Build | Հաւատրով Պիտի Կառուցենը!

While St. Hagop desperately needs a hall, we committed to defer construction until all monies have been raised, so full participation from each of our 570 community households is vital to our success! Your pledge of support will help provide a place:

- 1. To educate our children, youth and adults to be faithful, knowledgeable and active Armenian Christians through Sunday school classes, ACYOA retreats, Bible studies, etc.
- 2. To assemble Armenians throughout the country for fellowship, service and outreach
- 3. To preserve our Armenian heritage and culture through lectures/seminars and celebratory events such as weddings, baptisms, feast days, dances, etc., and
- 4. To live the Gospel daily by serving our church and surrounding community

Our small Narthex and sanctuary cannot adequately accommodate us; further space constraints restrict us from pursuing ministries we can and must pursue. We envision a church hall with a functional multi-purpose space and kitchen, classrooms, a conference room, and administrative offices (please refer to the attached floor plan.)

Only \$423,000 separates us from our goal and we need your participation - regardless of the amount you can contribute. Why? The church hall will belong to all of us. Your formal commitment, which we encourage to be proportional to your means, is more than a monetary contribution: It signifies your faithful commitment to St. Hagop and belief that our Armenian heritage must be perpetual." *Give and it will be given to you...For in the same measure you use it will measured back to you*" - Luke 6:38. All pledges may be fulfilled in installments.




